#### 3. Approval of Minutes - May 20, 2020 Board Meeting

Sue Scobert found a correction on page 2. Updated go live date for Aurora Fire from June 1<sup>st</sup> to July 1<sup>st</sup>. Phil Schneider made a motion to approve minutes with correction, seconded by Frank Schoenfeld, motion passed unanimously.

- **4. Public Comment**: Melissa Framiglio of Skyland Neighborhood Association announced she was present at this meeting. No further comments.
- 5. Communications: None.

### 6. Financial Report - May 2020 - John Hartsock

May report included in the meeting packet. John reported they are tracking on budget.

#### 7. FY 2020/2021 Budget Approval

Jim Davis made a motion to approve Resolution 01-20 adopting the budget for the Clackamas 800 Radio Group in the amount of \$17,563,253 for FY 2020/2021. Motion was seconded by Phil Schneider, motion passed unanimously.

### 8. Committee Reports

**Executive Committee - Sue Scobert:** The committee did not meet. Nothing to report.

**Technical Committee - John Hartsock:** John reported that the committee met on May 27<sup>th</sup>. They discussed alarm issues that addressed questions pertaining to site issues and system issues. They discussed antenna failure issues due to ice at Goat, which are now repaired. The group discussed CCOM and LOCOM upgrades. Their next meeting is June 24, 2020.

**Citizen Accountability- John Hartsock:** John stated they are meeting later tonight (June 17). John submitted an agenda item for the upcoming meeting to cover a motion to vote for four options that the board identified for use of the premium funds. One member that can't attend sent John his proxy vote to approve. Once approved at this meeting, John will bring to the county board for their approval.

Jim Davis asked for the Zoom invite to be sent. John will send out.

### 9. Old Business:

**System Management- Ron Polluconi:** Ron reported that there is a growing amount of interference on the C800 system. They are searching for the cause and so far, no substantial impact. Ron shared that they experienced a near complete outage last week on Site 1. They were down to 1 of 4 alternative systems and it took two full days to troubleshoot. They have since rebuilt and the system is restored.

Ron reported that they are watching for break-ins at tower sites. They had to file a report with Washington County Sheriff because of a break-in at a C800 site, a Verizon site and possibly the neighboring state site. There was no vandalism and there wasn't a lot of damage, however they are now keeping an eye on all sites. Ron said a notice was sent out to the sites a week ago.

Ron reported they are doing cut overs. A microwave contractor caused an unintentional reset which caused more sites on Hwy 26 to go down and created issues for 10 minutes. The contractor did not notify C800. Ron is going to reach out in attempt to improve communication.

### **System Upgrade/Replacement**

### Project Status/Procurement – Bjorn Morfin / John Hartsock:

Bjorn reported that he made a lot of progress. There are a small handful of sites that they are still working on, mainly forest service sites.

Memaloose - Contractors are working on the tower next week and its near completion.

Oak Grove – They are back working at this site. Grading and brushing was completed last year.

Whalehead – They are still working on power at this site. Brushing complete.

Tom Dick & Harry – Bjorn reported that he is still working on the final permit from the forest service.

West Linn – This site is the Cooks Butte replacement. Bjorn reported good progress with ODOT. They aim to have the lease by the end of July. The lease and permits could be approved about the same time. John reported that he has a bid packet out with bids due 6/23/20.

Goat Mtn: Bjorn reported that they are almost done with tower upgrade and should be completed this week. There is a separate contractor for the work on ground level work which is 6-8 weeks of work this summer with a completion date in the beginning of August.

John shared that CCOM and LOCOM are getting new console furniture CCOM is 95% complete and LOCOM will be installed later this year.

**Fire Station Alerting/Paging-John Hartsock:** John reported that the plan for the turn on date is July 15th. They are working on the Clackamas Fire stations and hope to be done by the end of June. They are currently dealing with permit issues with the Aurora stations but still hope to be up and running by July 15th.

Sue Scobert asked about US Digital and what was decided with the tones. Sue will discuss with Chief Corless.

**900 MHz Paging (voice) - Ron Polluconi:** Ron reported that they are going through antenna installations with two vendors. They experienced a small problem with the existing equipment, which they expected. Ron reported that the deployment of new paging radios will occur soon, and they hope to have all new stations installed by mid-September.

FSA – Ron reported working with USDD to see if they will support a text message concept sent for back up. He suspected that there might be nonrecurring fees.

John requested Ron update on the 800MHz voice paging? Ron reported that the product is still in existence. He noted the vendor is not spending much time on the P25 side. It's possible to implement it as we still have all technology designed into the system to support it. Ron has not heard back from the vendor or the distributor, but said he will continue to reach out to them to see if they can support it.

### Portable/Mobile Radio Deployment - Todd Matsuo

John reported deployment is continuing. They are down to the final radios and are still working with the Sheriff department. Ron reported that they are aiming to complete this by the end of August. He noted that the upgrades are taking a bit longer.

**Portable Radio Antenna- Ron Polluconi:** Ron reported that they have finished with the evaluations of the monoband and have pushed them out in smaller volumes. They have received very good feedback. They have ordered more and working with agencies to swap them out over the coming months.

On the Triband, Ron shared that Motorola came out with a prototype version. They were supposed to bring some to C800 to evaluate, but they went to Los Angeles first. They had less than optimal success and will be going back to the drawing board. Motorola should have prototypes for us to evaluate in about 6 weeks. Ron shared that they are still apprehensive about these antennas as they have had some complaints. If anyone is experiencing issues, they can swap out the triband antennas for the monoband antennas until the issue is resolved.

Ron stated that mass distribution of the multiband will begin in August or September, if they get pass the evaluation.

**DVRS** – **repeaters** – **Ron Polluconi:** Ron reported that he has not heard back from the FDB committee. Ron said we still maintain the test system which we use to keep the evaluation systems at an operating level. Ron shared that they are not going to see a major level of functionality until after the digital system is turned on.

**South County Fire Mutual Aid Radios – John Hartsock:** John shared an outline of where we are in the survey. He shared that the chief in Woodburn said that they are going after a grant to get multichannel radios that would alleviate the need. John said he would gather more information and will update everyone at the next meeting. We will be able to support this.

Ron shared that in Yamhill County have been going for grants and buying triband radios, mostly on the law enforcement side but fire is beginning to move that direction as well. We may begin to see law enforcement coming up on the system as mutual aid over the next few months. It should be fully live, likely by the end of the month.

#### 10. New Business (\*Action Item)

\* Approval of a change order with Summit Const for Goat Mtn – John Hartsock: John shared that this site will need extensive modifications from the structural engineer to meet requirements. They have been working with a crane for just over a month. The heavy work is done and they will be completing welding work for a few more weeks. This will approve the additional costs incurred.

Mark Havener made a motion to approve issuing a contract change order in the amount of \$191,269, seconded by Jim Band, motion passed unanimously.

\* Approval of a change order with Summit Const Wilsonville – John Hartsock: John shared that the original project bid included Canby, Sandy, and Damascus. This project was delayed significantly due to issues with landlord. There are some other changes that were required by county such as access road improvements and winter conditions on site.

Hopperstad made a motion to approve issuing a contract change order in the amount of \$116,377, Jim Band seconded, motion passed unanimously.

Radio Use of plain language – Sue Scobert: Sue shared that APCO (Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials) is an organization for communication centers nationally. The State of Oregon chapter has identified a path for plain language use throughout the state. CCOM is not willing to move forward right now. Oregon State Police have tentatively agreed to move to plain language this summer. Sue said she will send the document to the group for review. The group will discuss at the next meeting.

#### 11. Open Agenda

Jamie Poole shared that she met with PGE yesterday (June 16). They are working on a plan for public safety power shutoff to prepare for wildland season. The map showed that they plan to shut off power from below Welches up through Government Camp. She wanted to share with the group so we could figure out what towers would be affected and the timing for them to come back up. Jamie said she will get a copy of the map and connect with John and Ron. There is also a communications plan piece. People will need to know who to connect with at C800 if they would shut it off. She will work with Cheryl for the CCOM piece for the public.

**Re:** Radio Sites for Lake Oswego / West Linn to Provide In-Building Coverage

**DESCRIPTION:** One of the goals of the replacement and expansion of the C800 public safety radio system bond project was to provide improved in-building radio coverage in areas that are within the Urban Growth Boundary. In the Lake Oswego / West Linn area the team has reviewed in excess of forty different sites to accomplish this goal. This area is bounded by I-5 on the West / the Clackamas County line on the North to the Willamette River then east along the river to I-205 on the South / then I-205 back to -5 – it incorporates the City of Lake Oswego / City of West Linn / and unincorporated portions of Clackamas County.

**HISTORY:** After an extensive engineering review the two initial sites were selected - one on Cooks Butte and one on Kerr Road in Lake Oswego. After a preliminary neighborhood meeting on the Kerr Road site, the City of Lake Oswego requested that we do additional study. The City of Lake Oswego granted us a lease for the Cooks Butte site. After considerable engineering and design work the City terminated the lease due to a deed restriction issue and considerable public outcry.

An alternative to the Cooks Butte site is a site located at the SE corner of Upper Cherry Lane/Bergis Rd/Skyland in unincorporated Clackamas County. The landlord has granted a lease for the property to C800. This land is zoned EFU and thus more challenging to obtain land use. As with the above sites this site too has strong neighborhood objections.

Another alternative to the Cooks Butte site is one located at 19676 Kapteyns St in West Linn. This site is owned by ODOT who has advised they are willing to lease the site to C800. Though surrounded by the City of West Linn this 2+ acre parcel is within unincorporated Clackamas County for land use and permitting. The property is zoned FU10 and in accordance with the Clackamas Zoning Ordinance a public safety communications facility is an allowed use. As we were completing the required Type 1 land use process the City of West Linn requested a presentation to their City Council. This resulted in another considerable public outcry.

**NEXT STEPS:** After discussion with the County Administrator, Gary Schmidt, and the West Linn City Manager, John Williams, I am recommending that we stall the process of locating a site in this area for the time being. Gary Schmidt, through the County Resolution Services Agency, will organize a town hall meeting to review and make recommendations for a solution. The meeting is intended to include elected officials from the City of West Linn / City of Lake Oswego / Clackamas County / Lake Oswego Police and Fire officials / West Linn Police officials / Clackamas County Sheriff officials / Tualatin Fire and Rescue officials, as well as Citizen representatives from the area.

The plan is to hold this meeting in early January of 2021. Two reasons for waiting until January. First the new radio system will be on the air by that time and we will be able to document actual coverage of the system versus our computer models. We will be able to have public safety personnel provide firsthand description of the system.

The second reason is this will allow the election season to be over and any new elected officials to be in place.

After considerable discussion with the project team we feel this is the most effective way to address this situation. Charging ahead at this point will incur extensive costs for all parties and create considerable delays.

I ask for your concurrence with this direction.

### **DESCRIPTION:**

At the May C800 Board Meeting staff was requested to research the issue of Mutual Aid radios for South County Fire Agencies. On May 24<sup>th</sup> a poll was sent to all fire agencies requesting input on the issue. The following are the listing of the current mutual aid radios and the recommendation for the new system.

It was noted by Chief Budge at Woodburn Fire that the North Marion County Fire Districts have applied for a joint AFG grant for dual band radios. If the grant is successful, the C800 mutual aid radios will not be required.

**REQUEST:** It is hereby requested that the C800 Board of Directors approve purchasing a logging recorder system from Equature for CCOM and LOCOM in the amount of \$508,020.

**DESCRIPTION:** The existing logging recorder systems at CCOM and LOCOM are nearing their end of useful life. These are analog systems not compatible with the new digital radio system, CAD system, Next Gen 9-1-1 equipment. The new system will be a geo-diverse solution with 100% redundancy. The system at WCCCA will be interconnected with these systems to provide this redundancy. The replacement of the logging recorder system was included as part of the communications upgrade project.

The WCN technical team in concert with the PSAPS did extensive research of potential solutions. Three vendors were determined to be finalist that meant the requirements: Those vendors were NICE Inform / Verint / Equature. Equature was chosen after careful review and evaluation. It should be noted that the current solution is an early generation of Equature.

In accordance with ORS 279A-205 this procurement is being facilitated through a cooperative purchasing agreement.

**FINANCE**: The funds are budgeted in capital outlay as part of the Bond funding.

**LEGAL:** A C800 purchase order will be utilized as approved by legal counsel.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is hereby recommended that the C800 Board of Directors approve purchasing a logging recorder system from Equature for CCOM and LOCOM in the amount of \$508,020.

**DESCRIPTION:** In replacing the console equipment at CCOM it was determined that the grounding system for the consoles and related equipment was non-existent. There are extensive requirements from Motorola outlined in their R56 manual for appropriate system grounding. This grounding system is vitally important for dispatcher safety and the proper operation of all console equipment.

In concert with Motorola a scope of work was developed, and a Request for Proposal was issued on July 31, 2020 for the work. Proposals are due on August 18, 2020 from qualified vendors. C800 staff will evaluate the proposals and bring a recommendation to the August 19, 2020 meeting. Staff is taking this unusual approach to assure the work can be completed in time as to not delay the radio equipment install in the consoles.

**FINANCE**: The funds are budgeted in capital outlay as part of the Bond funding.
