1. C800 Board Meeting Called to Order at 1000 by Chair Deputy Chief Ryan Hari

3. Approval of Minutes – March 20, 2019 Board Meeting

a. Randy Hopperstad made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 20th Board meeting as submitted and the motion was seconded by Frank Schoenfeld. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.

4. Public Comment: None

5. Communications:

a. John shared that there is an audit letter from the Secretary of State's office in the packet. John has talked to our auditor and they are going to write us a response, answering the questions. John noted that most of the issues are clerical issues.

6. Financial Report-March 2019

a. John noted that the March financial information is included. He received the April numbers last night. He will email those out. He reported that there is nothing unusual, tracking on budget.

7. Open Budget Hearing

- a. **Present the Budget:** John shared that there are no changes to the budget from the Budget Committee meeting. We are staying at the same cost per radio that we had last year, but all budgets have gone down slightly, as the zone controller debt has been paid off. Everything else is the same as last month. No questions from the board.
- b. **Ask for public comment:** Ryan Hari asked if there was any public comment. No comment. Ryan closed the public hearing.
- c. *Approval of Resolution 19-1 FY 2019-2020 Proposed Budget: Jim Davis made a motion to approve Resolution 19-1 FY 2019/2020 Proposed Budget. The motion was seconded by Phil Schneider. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.

8. Committee Reports

- a. **Executive Committee**; Did not meet. No report.
- b. **Technical Committee-John Hartsock:** Last met on March 22nd. At that meeting, they went over the upgrades at CCOM, talked about: the new dispatch radio positions, site issues, and logging recorder presentations. Currently waiting on logging recorder proposals back from Motorola. Talked about the interfaces for both TriTech to Motorola for the radio system features as well as Fire Station Alerting. Also reviewed overall system replacement planning. Next meeting will be later in May.
- c. **Citizen Accountability-Ryan Hari:** Next meeting will be June 18, 2019, 6:30 pm at West Linn Police Department.

9. Old Business:

- a. **System Management:** John shared that Darin Miller from WACCA is at the meeting today. John shared that there are just normal problems with the system getting old and not doing what it is supposed to do. There was a hiccup with the microwave link being interrupted.
- b. **System Upgrade/Replacement:** Project Status/Procurement Bjorn reviewed project status:
 - 1. <u>Barton</u>. In construction proceeding on schedule. Tower foundations and site clearing complete. Should be complete mid to late June.
 - 2. <u>Cooks Butte</u>. Working through land use pre-submittal. Arborist developing City required plan.
 - 3. <u>Kerr Parkway</u>. Researching alternate candidates. Following up this week.
 - 4. Damascus/Canby/Sandy. Construction, antenna and radio installation complete.
 - 5. <u>Wilsonville.</u> Will discuss this site later in the meeting, asking for approval for eminent domain.
 - 6. <u>Crutcher Bench</u>. In construction. The power trench is complete. Foundations underway and moving along nicely.
 - 7. Highland Butte. Construction to start in July. Waiting on paperwork from BLM.
 - 8. <u>Four Forest Service Sites</u>. Have meeting on May 23rd. Expecting approval to move forward on all four.
 - 9. Hoodland Fire. Land use approved. Building permits have been submitted.
 - 10. <u>Brightwood</u>. Permits have been issued. Ground crews will start work probably next week on shelter upgrades.
 - 11. Existing sites. Lenhart, Mt. Scott, Pete's and Polivka are the tower swap sites. Expecting permits to be issued in the next weeks. Construction should start in 2-3 weeks.

c. Fire Station Alerting/Paging:

- 1. John shared that he has the US Digital contract for Chief Hari to sign today and we are moving forward with the fire station alerting project.
- 2. John noted that he has spoken with Mike Corless about using Nick Fisher at CFD #1 to help with the coordination of this system. All fire agencies will be hearing from Nick about this coordination (ex: right spots in the station, where you want things delivered to, data availability).
- 3. John shared that the goal is to have this system done by the end of this calendar year.
- 4. John said as the systems are installed they can be brought up using the 900 pager link. He added that we don't want to turn on the overall until they have them all up. We won't have an automated voice until the full system is operational.

- 5. Molalla has installed in three stations and CFD#1 has installed in two.
- 6. Phil Schneider asked questions about the bids they received, and if we are set on the \$30,000 stipend for the main Station and if it would be different for a sub-Station or staffed versus unstaffed stations. Mike Corless shared that Nick will be setting up appointments with the Stations to go through the designs. Jim Davis asked if Nick could also evaluate if he thinks the \$30,000 is appropriate. Jim also asked groups to remember to indicate on the survey, on excess bond money, what their priorities are for their Agency.

d. Portable/Mobile Radio Deployment:

- 1. John introduced Todd Matsuo, Project Manager for the radio system from Motorola, to talk about radio deployment.
- 2. Todd shared that they are largely through deploying the group's new subscribers. There are still some smaller Agencies they have to program and deploy.
- 3. Todd said that the big focus right now are all the existing APX's that they have to update. He explained the first step for this process is that they need to come out and read all the existing radios. Once they read the radios, they have to do an analysis and determine the "flash" upgrades needed to bring those up to the equivalent level of the new radios. Once they know all that, they get that all set up in their radio management system.
- 4. After that, Todd shared that they will come back out and start updating the fleet. The schedule for this will be on an Agency to Agency basis. He said to expect a radio mobile upgrade to take up to 45 minutes. They will work with the Agencies to figure out how many they can get out of service to update. Todd explained that it is going to be a bit of a process.
- 5. Right now, they are in the process of reading the radios. Some Agencies are ready for upgrades, West Linn Police and Sandy Police.
- 6. He shared he provides John with a weekly or bi-weekly update on where they are at. The Motorola project manager that will help with this is Joe Harris.
- 7. If there are any questions, reach out to Todd and he or Joe will get back to you. Give them a call with any questions about the new radios.
- 8. Jim Davis asked if they know what schedule is on when they will be out to our Agencies. Todd said they don't have a schedule right now.
- 9. Todd said it will take 2-3 weeks to get "flash" upgrades in.
- 10. Jim Davis brought up the educational piece for training the firefighters on the new template so that we don't have the same dilemma that other Agencies have had on how to run the new radios. John said they are working on having closer coordination, so this doesn't happen.
- 11. Richard Anderson asked about doing antenna updates at the same time of other updates. He asked if this is happening at the same time, or if that is something that is still pending. Todd said he will have to look into that.

e. Radio Templates

- 1. John shared that Detective Burlew with the Sheriff's department had some concerns about what templates were on what radios. James Rhodes shared some information from Detective Burlew; and provided a handout.
- 2. Detective Burlew's concern is that we are giving law enforcement talkgroups to non LE entities. Examples for these entities are: PGE, NW Natural Gas, Public Works, etc.
- 3. James is wondering about coming up with a template for those we want to share LE channels with and those we don't. He said there would be some exceptions to the rule.

- 4. John brought up transportation, Public Works Agencies. He said that currently, they have had dispatch 1, 2 and 3. He asked how they would contact dispatch if they didn't have one of those three.
- 5. Scott Thran brought up lake patrol.
- 6. Detective Burlew will be working on a presentation, proposed templates, etc. that James will ask him to bring to the next meeting.

f. Media Radio Use

- 1. C800 needs to develop a policy on how to accommodate News Agencies request for audio feeds from encrypted talkgroups. The recommendation is to provide a delayed audio stream via the internet. This would mean that qualified news agencies/outlets would be able to get streamed audio, five or ten minutes later.
- 2. Darin shared that for Washington County Sheriff, the media goes to an internet site or an app and get the information from the dispatch talkgroup on a 15-minute delay. Once you get beyond that, example: Detectives, etc. they are encrypted and not available for streaming.
- **3.** Darin also shared that it's a process and is going to slow down programming a bit. He shared that we do want to get it done on the front end.
- **4.** Richard shared that if we, Fire or Police, need to talk with private entities, we can switch channels to talk with them rather than giving the other entities encrypted radios.
- **5.** John shared that a unique news piece to consider is the news helicopters. Can the helicopter have a radio they can talk on or just listen?
- g. **Use of Bond Premium Funds:** Jim Davis shared that the survey has been sent out to the Law group. The goal would be to have the survey results back to present to this group by August or September. The results will be sent out prior to the meeting for review. Leanna will send out the survey again for the Fire group.

10. New Business: (*Action Item)

a. **Approve a Contract Change Order for Day Wireless-48V System:** Jim Band made a motion to authorize the C800 Board of Directors to approve issuing a contract change order in the amount of \$84,238.43 for additional 48V batteries at the Goat Mountain site, battery system for the Hoodland Fire site and AC wiring at all the sites. Mike Corless seconded the motion. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.

b. Award a Construction Contract for the Memaloose/ Whalehead/ Tom Dick & Harry/ Oak Grove Butte Sites

- 1. John shared that six firms provided bids and that all bidders have worked on our other projects. The low bidder was T3 Construction out of Roseburg, OR. He noted they have been very impressed with their efforts. T3 has a long history with doing this type of work with the Forest Service. They are also a logging company.
- 2. Jim Davis made a motion to authorize the C800 Board of Directors to enter into a contract with T3 Construction Roseburg, OR in the total amount of \$1,166,000 to construct communication sites at the Memaloose/ Whalehead/ Oak Grove/ Tom Dick & Harry sites. Further to establish an allowance of \$3,930,000 for utility extensions and road improvements. Randy Hopperstad seconded the motion.
- 3. Jim Band asked about the allowance amount. John explained that in total, we have ten miles of power extension that we need to do from the PGE meet point at the bottom of the hill, up the roads. They will need to do some road maintenance as well. They will need to gravel and cut the

- roads a bit wider. For these additional projects, they will submit a price and need to justify the work prior to doing it. John shared that we will be monitoring this as we go along. Ryan and John noted that every bidder would have had the same allowance amount given to them.
- 4. Discussion about how we will know if the work done with the allowance is a fair bid. Jim requested that the group get updates on how this project is going as it goes along.
- 5. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.

c. * Authorize A Site Use Agreement with PGE

- 1. John explained that PGE wants to place three radios at five of our sites. If they decide they want to add more, they have to come back to the table. PGE preferred to pay in one payment, so they can capitalize it rather than expense it out. They went through the rate schedule over fifteen years to come up with the amount they would pay in a one-time payment.
- 2. Jim Band made a motion to authorize the C800 Board of Directors to enter into an agreement with PGE to allow their use of the Timberline/Brightwood/Memaloose/Oak Grove Butte/Mt. Scott/CCOM for their radio system for fifteen years for a one-time compensation of \$2,675,000. James Rhodes seconded the motion. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.

d. * Authorize Eminent Domain Proceedings form Wilsonville Site

- 1. John shared that Cynthia Fraser with Garvey Schubert Barer, P.C., the attorney C800 retained, has prepared a draft solution for obtaining the access easement to the Wilsonville site. That is to do an eminent domain proceeding. First step is to have an appraiser develop a value of the easement. This is an easement that already exists for the City of Wilsonville's access to their site. If the land was ever developed, there would be public roads that would provide access.
- 2. John shared that so far, they have spent three years on this site, making many contacts and looked at numerous sites. He noted they are still continuing to look at alternatives, but this is the best site they have found for coverage out there.
- 3. Ryan asked if John had a dollar amount of how much we have spent so far. Ryan said that about a year ago, we had spent about \$50,000 of C800 money on this site. Ryan mentioned again that the easement already exists and is already being used by the City of Wilsonville.
- 4. John shared that we have land use approval. He added that Roger May, the property owner, did not apposed the land use at the Citizen's meeting.
- 5. John also shared that originally, he thought with eminent domain, we had to take the whole property, but he said that we can do just the easement.
- 6. Jim Davis asked how much longer it will take, if the group is in favor of this eminent domain option. John shared that it depends on how the property owner takes it. If the owner signs, it will probably be less than a month. John noted it is hard to predict. He will have a better prediction once Cynthia has a chance to talk with the owner.
- 7. Randy Hopperstad made a motion to authorize the C800 Board of Directors to approve Resolution 02-19, authorizing the use of eminent domain to acquire access to the Wilsonville site access easement. Mike Corless seconded the motion. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.

John,

I've gone through the Secretary of State's letter and here are my responses:

- 1. State is confused over the use of the term "deferred" maintenance charges as there are now Deferred Inflow/Outflow categories on the statement of net position (which this item is not). We have reported this correctly, however, to make it clear to the State, we will rename that line "Prepaid Item" and disclose in the footnotes going forward.
- 2. C800 has no liabilities in excess of 1 year, so again, the State is incorrect.
- 3. To clarify the nature of C800's receivables, I suggest changing the description from "Receivables" to "Due from other governments" going forward.
- 4. State is confused over presentation of leases versus long-term debt in the footnotes. Lease disclosure does not require principal and interest separation, long-term debts do. Current presentation is correct.
- 5. State is correct. Since budget requirement is not mandatory for C800, the presentation of budget versus actual comparison is presented under "Supplementary Information" and not "Required Supplementary Information". We will correct this nomenclature going forward.
- 6. Is required in OAR's but I've never seen it in practice. Will expand address description at bottom of page 1 to read..."Address of Officers and Board Members".

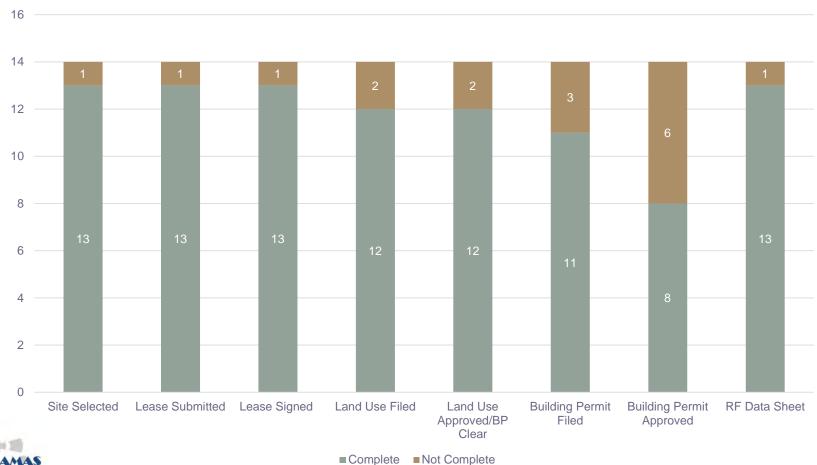

Re: Radio Purchase Stipend for Aurora Fire District

REQUEST: It is hereby requested that the C800 Board of Directors authorize C800 to provide Aurora Fire District a radio stipend of \$40,920 for the purchase of new digital radios for their operations.

DESCRIPTION: As a part of the communication system upgrade project a stipend to assist C800 agencies in purchasing required digital capable subscriber radios (portables/mobiles) was developed. In general terms the stipend was intended to cover approximately 50% or the cost of the radios the balance being paid by the respective agency. The stipend amount in the bond budget was \$5,000,000. To develop the per radio/agency value the number of radios on the system as of May 2016 was divided into the \$5M for a per radio value of \$2,727.77. The radio count includes all Partner agencies, Member agencies, and Mutual Aid agencies.

Aurora Fire, a mutual aid agency, is intending on purchasing 69 new digital radios to be able to maintain communications with Canby Fire / Molalla Fire / TVF&R. Further Aurora Fire is requesting to be dispatched by CCOM and if approved would also request to become a partner in C800. As of May 2016 Aurora Fire had 15 radios on the system and there by we budgeted a stipend of \$40,920 for them.

A concern was raised about utilizing Clackamas County Bond Funds to pay for equipment from another jurisdiction. There are two justifications for this request: 1) Aurora Fire performs many mutual aid calls into Clackamas County thus serving the citizens of the County at no additional cost to them. 2) Aurora Fire District has 13.6 square miles of its 64 square miles within Clackamas County or 21%. The 15 radios on the system is 21% of the 69 radios they intend on purchasing.

FINANCE: The funds are budgeted in capital outlay as part of the Bond funding.

LEGAL: A memorandum of understanding will be utilized as approved by legal counsel.

RECOMMENDATION: It is hereby recommended that the C800 Board of Directors authorize C800 to provide Aurora Fire District a radio stipend of \$40,920 for the purchase of new digital radios for their operations.

Re: Award of Construction Contract for the Hoodland-Brightwood Site.

REQUEST: It is hereby requested that the C800 Board of Directors authorize C800 to enter into a contract with Summit Construction Sisters, OR in the amount of \$321,329 to construct the communication site at Hoodland-Brightwood.

DESCRIPTION: As a part of the communication system upgrade project there is a site being added at Hoodland fire station in Brightwood. We prepared bid documents which were posted on ORPIN on May 13, 2019 for bids. Thirty firms downloaded the documents. On June 6, 2019 two firms submitted bid proposals ranging from \$\$321,329 to \$389,457. The project estimate was \$325,000. Both of the firms were qualified and presented the appropriate bid packages.

Summit is the firm that is constructing the Damascus, Canby, Sandy, Wilsonville sites and is performing to our expectations. We are pleased that they were the successful contractor.

FINANCE: The funds are budgeted in capital outlay as part of the Bond funding.

LEGAL: A C800 construction contract will be utilized as approved by legal counsel.
