#### i. C800 Board Meeting Called to Order at 0900

#### iii. Approval of Minutes – November 20, 2019 Board Meeting

- **a.** Mike Corless made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 20, 2019 Board meeting as submitted and the motion was seconded by Jim Davis. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.
- iv. Public Comment: None.
- v. Communications: None.

Sue Scobert called for an Executive Session. She recessed the regular board meeting at 9:24 am for the Executive Session, related to Real Property Negotiations. She shared that per ORS 192.660 (2) (e), Executive sessions are closed to the public. Representatives of the news media and designated staff and guest shall be allowed to attend. All other members of the audience are asked to leave the room. Representatives of the news media are specifically directed not to report on any of the deliberations during the executive session, except to state the general subject of the session as previously announced. No decision may be made in executive session.

The Executive Session was called to order at 9:24 am.

The regular board meeting reconvened at 10:05 am.

vi. Financial Report

**a.** John Hartsock shared that the financial information was included in the packet. He noted that things are tracking on schedule and on budget.

#### vii. Committee Reports

#### a. Executive Committee-Sue Scobert

i. The committee did not meet. Nothing to report.

#### b. Technical Committee-John Hartsock

i. Met on November 27<sup>th</sup>. They discussed system operation, fire station alerting and site issues. Continuing to work on logging recorder update and system replacement planning.

#### c. Citizen Accountability- John Hartsock

- **i.** They met last night December 17, 2019 and there were five members plus others in attendance. The meeting went well.
- **ii.** The Committee had a fair amount of concern and comments regarding the Lake Oswego site issue.
- **iii.** The Committee reviewed the options presented by the C800 Board for usage of the premium bond dollars. The options presented were acceptable to the group. They will vote on this a their April meeting.

#### viii. Old Business:

#### a. System Management- Ron Polluconi

- i. Ron shared that all preventative maintenance for the year was finished up for winterization.
- **ii.** They are upgrading all of the existing sites. He added that a large part of this is replacing the emergency power systems. In the process of doing that, they have had some issues with the generator service provider. They have not had the visibility they contracted for. They have moved to WCCCA staff taking this over.
- iii. Things are looking stable going into winter.

#### b. System Upgrade/Replacement

- i. Project Status/Procurement
  - Bjorn reviewed project status:
    - 1. Barton/Damasus/Sandy/Canby/Crutcher Bench: Construction is complete.
    - 2. <u>Hoodland Fire/Brightwood</u>: Almost complete. The crew is remodeling the building.
    - 3. Wilsonville: In construction. Anticipate completion by January 31, 2020.
    - 4. <u>Highland Butte:</u> Pouring concrete this week. Anticipate completion by January 31, 2020.
    - 5. <u>Tom/Dick & Harry/Memaloose/Whale Head/Oak Grove (USFS):</u> Construction is underway on Memaloose/Whalehead/Oak Grove-access easement is being obtained for TD&H. Goal is to start next spring, with a June 2020 completion, depending on weather.
    - 6. Cooks Butte: Will discuss alternative site late in meeting Cooks is on hold.
    - 7. <u>Brightwood/Lenhart/Pete's/Polivka/Day Hill/Mt. View/Redland Rd./Sawtell/View Acres: Complete with exception of minor pick up items.</u>
    - 8. <u>Mt. Scott:</u> The power situation has been squared away. Tower replacement will start next week.
    - 9. Kerr Parkway Water Tank: Researching alternative locations.

- 10. <u>Goat Mt.</u>: Wrapping up the upgrades to the ground equipment. Tower upgrades (structural) are on hold due to the time of year and related weather. They will wait until spring when the snow is gone to complete the work.
- 11. <u>Timberline:</u> Need to follow up with the Forest Service regarding the fuel tank.
- 12. CCCOM: Virtually complete.
- Bjorn shared that things are moving along well.
- John shared that the next two pages in the packet shared the project history and status.
  He added that this was done to address the issue of us being behind and explains why.
  He said that the biggest reason is land use issues, primarily with the Forest Service sites. He thought this was important to share the history on how we got to where we are today.
- John shared information about the schedule. He noted that they have started discussions with Motorola on cutting over the new system. He expressed that this is a fairly complicated act. John shared that they are looking for finishing the design and construction by June of 2020, existing site upgrades in January of 2020 and system operational by August 2020 with the exception of Lake Oswego.
- John shared that we are running about six million dollars under budget.
- John shared that they received questions at the Citizens Accountability meeting last night about the budget and overruns. He will prepare a report, by line item to share with the citizens. He will also share this with the Board.
- John reviewed the quarterly outlook for Q1-2020
  - o Procurement-Bid and award security/CCTV system
  - Leases & Land Use Applications- Determine Lake Oswego sites/submit land use
  - Site Construction Complete Wilsonville/Highland Butte/Whalehead/ Oak
     Grove Butte/ Memaloose/ Tom, Dick & Harry/Goat Mt.
  - Radio/Microwave- Continue radio infrastructure install, continue microwave system install, and finalize subscriber radio distribution and existing radio upgrades.
    - John shared that they are waiting on a schedule for Microwave networks.
    - He noted that keeping the old system running while getting the new one up is complicated. They want to start testing soon.
    - He shared that they will need to make some modifications to the microwave system map.
- John reviewed the pictures that were in the packet.

#### c. Fire Station Alerting/Paging

- i. John shared that the fire station alerting was moving along well and making good progress. He added that during an electrical inspection on the installation at the Hoodland Fire Station, and there was no UL label, so that brought the process to a halt. They are waiting for an answer from USDD. They have done all the testing. They are hoping to get a resolution this week.
- **ii.** John shared that for paging, they got a notice that they are sending a partial shipment next week.

#### d. Portable/Mobile Radio Deployment

- i. Todd with Motorola wasn't in attendance.
- **ii.** John shared that they are continuing to distribute radios and re-work existing radios. He added that they are staying on top of it. He asked the group to let him know if there were any concerns or questions.
- **iii.** John shared that one thing Canby Fire found, was that one of the buttons on the remote speaker mic is programed to change channels. John added that they will be reprograming this; Darren will fix this for anyone who has these mics.
- iv. Ron shared information about the radio antennas.
  - a. Ron explained that they have settled on a single band antenna. He noted that they are looking for folks who have areas of scratchy and noisy signals, who they can give seven to ten antennas to, to test these out and give feedback, prior to doing a wholesale distribution.
  - b. Ron shared that they don't want things to stay same or get worse, they want things to improve.
  - c. Ron shared that you can send an email request or a CCOOM staff member and then they will get you the specially marked antennas.
  - d. Ron explained that the lab results look good, but they want to the feedback from agencies in order to make a good and effective decision on whether or not to push forward with this.
  - e. Ron shared that for the tri-band, they are looking at a later deployment sometime in August. He noted that they found a possible solution. He shared that they will probably see something coming up the first quarter of the calendar year. Those will be evaluation antennas initially.
  - f. He noted that with these as well, the laboratory stuff looks good, but they will be relying on the real word feedback from this group to see if it is best to deploy to the group.
  - g. Ron explained that they will be collecting the same data in Washington County. They will put together and provide a report to this group before making any decisions.
  - h. Ron noted that they are very complicated antennas, compared to the "good old days," when they were much simpler. He added that because of this, they have to have a closer eye on these designs as they go out.

#### e. Radio Templates: No updates

#### f. Use of Bond Premium Funds

i. John shared that they met with the County Commissioners on the 10<sup>th</sup> of December. It went well. They were appreciative of the information and were very positive about the project. The Commissioners were informed that C800 would be coming back to them regarding the bond premium dollars in about June 2020.

#### ix. New Business: (\*Action Item)

#### a. Amendment to the Clackamas County/C800 Bond IGA

- i. John passed around a copy of the amendment that they have been working on with the county. He noted they are relatively close to getting this squared away.
- ii. John shared that the original IGA compensated the County for their time involved in processing the bond. They had come back and asked for 1% of the bond to cover their costs. John shared that they are not anticipating a lot of third party costs.
- iii. Eileen shared that it was clear from the amendment that they are looking for more specificity, which helps both sides. She explained that the question is the amount they are asking, and whether or not the group agrees with that amount. It was noted that the amount would come out of the interest earnings.

iv. It was decided to have the group review the amendment, give more time for John and the county to discuss and it will be brought back to the group. The county will also put this on the January meeting agenda for the county to discuss.

### b. \*Approve Engagement letter with Northwest Local government Legal Advisors, LLC- Formerly Law Offices of Eileen Eakins, LLC.

- **i.** John shared that Eileen has decided to expand her practice to a larger group. He noted that item e is the new engagement letter. She has represented this group since 2006.
- ii. John noted that he is looking for approval on the letter attached with the fees.
- **iii.** Jim Davis made a motion for the C800 Board of Directors to approve the Engagement Letter with Northwest Local Government Legal Advisors, LLC. Mike Corless seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### c. \* Approve a change order to Todd Hess construction- Hoodland

- i. John shared that this is for the additional work that they are performing at the Hoodland site. The shelter was a used shelter from Sandy. They are replacing some of the AC units. It is a change order to their design build contract for site upgrades.
- **ii.** Randy Hopperstad made a motion for the C800 Board of Directors to approve issuing a contract change order in the amount of \$67,593 for the remodel of the Hoodland site to Todd Hess Building Co. Ernie Roberts seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

#### d. \*Provide Direction- City of Lake Oswego/Cooks Butte Lease Termination

- **i.** Sue Scobert shared that John is looking for direction in regards to the City of Lake Oswego/Cooks Butte Lease Termination.
- **ii.** Ernie Roberts made a motion to inform the City of Lake Oswego of the costs we have incurred to date and accept termination of the lease. John Schmerber seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### e. Acceptance of FY 2018/2019 Audit

i. Mike Corless made a motion for the C800 Board of Directors to accept the Audit Report for year ended June 30, 2019 as prepared by Jarrard, Seibert, Pollard & Co. Jim Davis seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### x. Open Agenda

- **a.** John shared that the Board meeting scheduled for the 2020 year is attached.
- **b.** John noted that Vince Stafford has advised that he needs to step down as Vice Chair, because has his Board meetings on Wednesday mornings. John noted they need a new Second Vice Chair.
- **c.** Jim Davis nominated Rick Huffman to be the Second Vice Chair. John added that Rick Huffman would also be added as a check signer and Vince would be removed from the bank account. Mike Corless seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### xi. Public Comment

- **a.** A citizen wanted to confirm that with Cooks Butte, the group is terminating the lease and asking the City of Lake Oswego to reimburse some costs. He asked if this meant that the priority now will be the Skyland site.
- **b.** John shared that the group potentially has another site in the West Linn area, that we originally didn't think was available due to height restrictions that have been relaxed. John shared that the project team is still needing to sort this out, and it will probably take a couple weeks to do so. It was noted more information will be reported on this at the next meeting.







### **Project History and Status**

#### **Brief History:**

Conceptual planning for upgrade of the public safety radio systems in the Portland Metro Area started in 2008 due to an aging communications infrastructure. The planning team was a partnership of City of Portland, Clark County, Washington (CRESA), Washington County Consolidated Communications Agency (WCCCA) and Clackamas 800 Radio Group (C800). The planning team was assisted by the IXP Corporation and a \$1M Homeland Security Grant to propose a system of systems approach for providing public safety communications for the region. City of Portland and CRESA choose to construct an independent system. C800/WCCCA chose to continue their partnership and build a joint system. All 4 system interoperate with each other.

Ballot Measure 3-476 approved in May 2016 authorized \$59M in general obligation bonds to replace and upgrade the public safety radio communications system serving Clackamas County. The Bonds were sold on November 3, 2016. Clackamas County entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Clackamas 800 Radio Group on December 19, 2016 to execute and manage the project.

The initial schedule was for the Project to be completed by June 2019. We have made considerable progress but have been delayed, primarily in site acquisition and therefor site construction. The anticipated completion date has been extended to August 2020.

#### Architectural and Engineering Services:

Months of pre-planning, including determining potential sites, allowed site acquisition, architectural and engineering services, for the 14 new sites to begin at once as well as upgrade designs for existing sites. The value of these contracts is \$2.8M of which we have spent \$2.5M.

#### Equipment:

Procurement of major project elements began in earnest in December 2016. The contract to Motorola for the key components of the radio system and the portable and mobile radios for the public safety users was awarded in August 2017 in the amount of \$33.9 Million. The contract to Microwave Networks Inc for site interconnectivity was awarded in November 2018 in the amount of \$3.1 Million. Contracts for radio site shelters for \$1.6 M / communication towers for \$1.3 M / 48 Volt power systems for \$1.4 M all awarded in mid-2018. To date we have expended \$31 M for these items.

#### Status of the 13 existing sites:

Seven of the existing sites required seismic stabilization, new HVAC, new emergency generators and fuel tanks,. These sites were complete in early 2019. The remaining six required replacement of the communication towers due to structural needs. The work was bid and awarded in May 2019. The work at these sites is now complete except for the Mt Scott site which will be completed in late December 2019.





### **Project History and Status**

#### Status of the 14 new sites:

The first three new sites were leased by early 2017 and two more by early 2018. Those five proceeded to land use approval, design and permitting, and construction, and are now complete.

The site at Wilsonville site is now under construction and anticipated completion is January 2020. The Wilsonville site was approved by the landlord in early 2018. However, the lease was delayed until August 2019 due to an access easement from an adjoining property owner.

The Highland Butte site lease was submitted in June 2016 to Bureau of Land Management (BLM). Approving the project was lengthy primarily due to NEPA (national environmental protection act) issues and internal BLM delays. Construction is underway and anticipated to be complete by January 2020.

The four US Forest Service sites at Whalehead, Memaloose, Oak Grove Butte, and Tom Dick & Harry, were submitted to USFS in February 2016. The USFS had long delays in approving this project. The final application was over 1,000 pages with many maps and related reports. Our design team to struggled with timely responses.

We received the lease for Whalehead, Memaloose, and Oak Grove Butte in July of 2019 but were not approved to proceed with construction until October 2019. Due to this being a snow site, final construction will not likely be complete until late spring / early summer 2020.

Skyland - This site has been delayed due to the uncertainty about moving forward with the site at Cooks Butte Park in Lake Oswego. C800 has been attempting to obtain a site at Cooks Butte going back to 2002 as it provides the best radio coverage for Lake Oswego. Due to a deed restriction on the Cooks Butte property, the Skyland location was chosen as an alternate in March 2016. A lease was signed for Skyland soon thereafter. The team proceeded to prepare the land use application for the Skyland site until we were advised that the deed restriction for Cooks Butte was released in late 2017. The City of Lake Oswego granted a lease for Cooks Butte to C800 in April f 2018. The team began working through the development process for Cooks Butte in early 2018 to date. The City's land use process is complex and arduous and has taken until now to develop the submittal materials. The City advised us on November 12, 2019 that they are requesting that C800 abandon the lease. It is anticipated that we are now going back to the Skyland site with anticipation of submitting for land use as quickly as possible. This site will likely be appealed, and construction start is unknown, but could be two years out.


Finally, based on coverage predictions we need a second site in the north of Lake Oswego. We looked at a potential site on Kerr Road at a Lake Oswego water department site but at this moment in time it does not look likely. We are continuing to search for a site.







### I. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

Clackamas 800 Radio Group is committed to fair employment practices and non-discrimination, including pay equity for all employees. We do not discriminate based on a protected class such as race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, age, disability, marital status, citizenship, national origin, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by law including in the payment of wages or screen applicants based on their current or past compensation.

### II. PURPOSE - STATEMENT PROHIBITING WORKPLACE HARASSMENT

Clackamas 800 Radio Group is committed to providing a work environment in which all individuals are treated respectfully. All employees of Clackamas 800 Radio Group should have the expectation that they work in a professional environment and that Clackamas 800 Radio Group promotes equal employment opportunities and prohibits unlawful discriminatory practices, including harassment.

Clackamas 800 Radio Group expects that all relationships among persons will be respectful and professional, free of bias, prejudice and harassment in the workplace, at work related event, or any activity coordinated by or through the organization.

### III. POLICY

This policy applies to all employees, elected officials, board or commission members, volunteers, interns and any other person we interact with in the course of accomplishing the work of the organization.

This workplace harassment policy has been developed to ensure that all employees can work in an environment free from unlawful harassment, discrimination and retaliation. Clackamas 800 Radio Group] will make every reasonable effort to ensure that all concerned are familiar with these policies and are aware that any complaint in violation of these policies will be investigated and resolved appropriately.

Discrimination, harassment and retaliation are not acceptable.

Any employee who has questions or concerns about these policies should talk with our primary contact C800 Manager as an alternative you may reach C800 Board Chair.

### A. RETALIATION

Clackamas 800 Radio Group encourages reporting of all perceived incidents of discrimination or harassment. Reports of incidents of discrimination and harassment will be promptly and thoroughly investigated. We prohibit retaliation against any individual who reports discrimination or harassment or participates in an investigation of such reports.

### **B. SEXUAL HARASSMENT**

Sexual harassment constitutes discrimination and is illegal under federal and state laws.

For the purposes of this policy, "sexual harassment" is defined as unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature when, for example: a) submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment, b) submission to or

rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as the basis for employment decisions affecting such individual, or c) such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive working environment.

Under Oregon Law sexual assault defined as unwanted conduct of a sexual nature that is inflicted upon a person or compelled through the use of physical force, manipulation, threat, or intimidation.

### C. HARASSMENT

Harassment based on any other protected class is also strictly prohibited. For this policy, harassment is verbal, written or physical conduct that denigrates or shows hostility or aversion toward an individual because of his or her race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, national origin, age, disability, marital status, citizenship, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by law, or that of his or her relatives, friends or associates, and that: a) has the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive work environment, b) has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance, or c) otherwise adversely affects an individual's employment opportunities.

### D. REPORTING AN INCIDENT OF HARASSMENT, DISCRIMINATION OR RETALIATION

Clackamas 800 Radio Group encourages individuals who believe they are being subjected to such conduct to promptly advise the offender that their behavior is unwelcome and to request that it stop. Often this action alone will resolve the problem. We recognize, however, that an individual may prefer to pursue the matter through complaint procedures.

Clackamas 800 Radio Group encourages reporting of all perceived incidents of discrimination, harassment or retaliation, regardless of the offender's identity or position. Individuals who believe that they have been the victim of such conduct should discuss their concerns with C800 Manager or C800 Board Chair See the complaint procedure described in section E.

Following receipt of a complaint or concern management will follow-up every three months for one year to ensure no further concerns or retaliation are experienced. However, employees should not wait for the management follow-up to share related experiences. If an employee would like the follow-up to discontinue the follow-up process a request must be submitted in writing to the C800 Manager.

### E. COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

Individuals who believe they have been the victims of conduct prohibited by this policy or believe they have witnessed such conduct should discuss their concerns with C800 Manager if you are unable to reach the primary contact please reach out to C800 Board Chair. We encourage employees to document the event(s), associated date(s), and potential witnesses.

Clackamas 800 Radio Group encourages the prompt reporting of complaints or concerns so that action can be taken quickly. Early reporting and intervention are very often the most effective method of resolving actual or perceived incidents of harassment. However, complaints and concerns may be brought forward within four years of the alleged violation. We encourage employees to document the events, associated dates, and potential witnesses.

Any reported allegations of harassment, discrimination or retaliation will be investigated quickly. The investigation may include individual interviews with the parties involved and, where necessary, with individuals who may have observed the event(s) or may have other relevant knowledge.

Clackamas 800 Radio Group will maintain confidentiality throughout the investigatory process to the extent possible with acceptable investigation and appropriate corrective action.

Misconduct constituting harassment, discrimination or retaliation will be dealt with appropriately. Responsive action may include training, referral to counseling or corrective action. Examples of possible corrective action may include a warning, written reprimand, reassignment, temporary suspension without pay, or termination] as Clackamas 800 Radio Group believes appropriate under the circumstances.

False and malicious complaints of harassment, discrimination or retaliation, as opposed to complaints that, even if erroneous, are made in good faith, may be the subject of appropriate disciplinary action.

We encourage employees to bring their concerns and complaints to the organization, and understand that, at times however, this may not be the choice of the employee. Below is a list of the external complaint options. Please reach out to the preferred choice to determine the appropriate timelines for their processes.

- Civil or Criminal Action. In these circumstances, a Notice of Claim must be provided to us in accordance with ORS 30.275.

### F. EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENTS

No employee will be required or invited to sign an agreement requiring the non-disclosure of information related to discrimination or sexual assault as a condition of employment, continued employment, promotion, compensation or the receipt of benefits. An employee may request this type of agreement and, upon request, will be provided at least seven (7) days to change their mind.

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
