1. C800 Board Meeting Called to Order at 1001 by Chair Deputy Chief Ryan Hari

3. Approval of Minutes – January 23, 2019 Board Meeting

- a. Randy Hopperstad made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 23, 2019 board meeting minutes as submitted and the motion was seconded by Brett Smith. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.
- 4. Public Comment: None
- **5.** Communications: None
- **6. Financial Report** John Hartsock stated that the financial report is included in the packet. We are tracking on budget and there are no irregularities to report.

7. Committee Reports

- a. Executive Committee: Did not meet. Working on getting check signing done
- b. Technical: Met on January 23rd. Mostly talked about CAD interfaces. The next meeting is on the February 27th at CCOM.
- c. Citizen Accountability: Next meeting on March 19th 6:30p at Canby Police Department

8. Old Business:

- a. System Management: Ron Polluconi: Ron stated that things are holding together pretty well. The snow has not affected us yet. There was a brief outage between the two systems. There were tower crews up there, and they put themselves between the microwave antennas.
- b. System Upgrade/Replacement:
 - i. Project Status/Procurement-Bjorn Morfin
 - 1. <u>Barton Site:</u> In the permitting stage. Working through some issues with the building department. Hoping to have that figured out mid-March.

- 2. <u>Cooks Butte:</u> Working toward getting land use application prepared; hoping to get that in by the end of April. There is an arborist working at site now. They still have a pre-application meeting with the city and also a neighborhood meeting. Moving along slowly but surely.
- 3. <u>Sandy/Damascus/Canby:</u> Still cleaning up a few items at these Sites construction complete/Motorola installing.
- 4. <u>Wilsonville:</u> Identified about 12 more sites that they have mailings, voicemails or emails out to. Hoping to find something as a backup.

5. BLM:

- a. <u>Crutcher Bench-</u> The bridge is done. Currently have GC bringing in power. Hoping to get BLM out there soon; in next week or so.
- b. <u>Highland Butte-</u> John and Bjorn will be meeting with BLM hopefully in the next two weeks to get a tree purchase agreement figured out and signed.
- 6. <u>4 Forest Service Sites:</u> Going to the line officer on February 26th. This will be the final approval to go out for public comment. If all goes well, hoping to get permits in April.
- 7. Hoodland Fire: Land use was submitted last week.
- 8. <u>Existing Sites:</u> Still moving along well. A little clean-up work to do, but things are progressing.

Jim Davis asked which sites need to be completed before the system can be turned on. John shared that Ron's short answer was, all of them. John stated that it has to do with the microwave network. He shared they are tracking and then will go into testing. Testing is four to six months. He said we have a guarantee of coverage from Motorola. They are hoping to have everything up toward the end of the year.

Jim Band asked if it would be helpful to have a Police Chief or a Fire Chief at these meetings; sharing to not hesitate to reach out. John shared that they have reached out for some meetings and it is helpful to have the Chiefs there. Discussion to follow.

- ii. Fire Station Alerting/Paging: Down to three Fire Agencies to submit needs. Hoping to bring the whole package to the Board at the next meeting.
- iii. Portable/Mobile Radio Deployment: No one at the meeting from Motorola. Ron apologized to the group that Motorola has not been doing the job that they set them forward to do. He shared that Motorola was supposed to be communicating with everyone before handing them a box or pallet full of stuff. They were supposed to sit down and explain the information they have been working on the past two years. He said the communications have been poor or non-existent. He shared they are working with Motorola to try and address this issue. In the meantime, to fill the gap, they plan to use a process/partial process that they are using in Washington County; they hook you up with one of their techs, aimed at providing training, that will be able to explain how the radios work and make sure that the first 3 zones that you are receiving are what you are expecting. If you need something, let them know.

It was asked if they have been given feedback from the line users that were concerned about the channel identifiers. Ron discussed different aliases/channel names with various Agencies and Portland. He noted that Portland is supposed to be using our talk groups as we deploy them out. Ron will get back with Portland to ask about their channel names. He noted how Portland has very short abbreviations. Sue shared that someone from the City of Portland made a cheat sheet for them. She will send this out to others. Discussion to follow.

iv. Use of Bond Premium Funds:

- 1. A committee was set up last month comprised of: Jim Davis, Brett Smith, Mike Corless and Scott Thran. Jim shared that Ryan sent out a list of potential uses of the funds. Jim and Mike assembled the list and solicited out the fire users for more input with a survey. He asked to please get input to Mike or Jim by Friday. They will prioritize the list and present back to the group. Brett Smith stated that the law side hasn't met yet. He noted if the survey is something that works well, they can piggyback on the survey to the law users.
- 2. Ryan said that they want everyone's voices heard. He asked for the group to please fill out the survey when they receive it.
- 3. Jim Band shared that he felt there should be a conversation if the money should be spent at all. He said that we need to make sure everyone understands what the bond premium is. It was discussed that when they bring the recommendations, this can be discussed at the same time.
- 4. John shared that the "report" we create is what we present to the citizens group and it should include all the options. Jim Band noted about going through the process and being honest and accountable for spending the money.

9. New Business: (*Action Item)

- a. Accept the FY 2017/2018 Financial Audit.
 - i. John shared that he sent the audit out after the last meeting. He noted it was a clean audit, no comments.
 - ii. Motion made by Jim Band to authorize the C800 Board of Directors to accept the Audit Report for the year ended June 30, 2018 as prepared by Jarrard, Seiber, Pollard & Co. Second by Sue Scobert. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.
- b. * Approval of Change Order to Saber Towers.
 - i. John shared that we ended up with 5 sites where we had to replace the towers so that they meet structural requirements and capabilities. John shared they received quotes for this work and Saber Industries was the most cost-effective option.
 - ii. It was asked where this money is coming from. John shared that the money is under towers; bond budget money. This is not a contingency hit.
 - iii. Motion made by Jim Band to authorize the C800 Board of Directors to approve issuing two change orders in the cumulative amount of \$486,627 to Saber Industries for the purchase of replacement towers at the Lenhart/Polivka/Mt. Scott communications sites, a new tower for the Hoodland site, and tower upgrades for the Memaloose, Whalehead, Oak Grove, and Tom Dick & Harry Sites. Second by Vince Stafford. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.
- c. * Approval of Change Order to SecuraSite.
 - i. John shared that SecuraSite was hired to do all of site acquisition work and permit coordination. He noted they are doing a great job.
 - ii. One issue is that some Sites haven taken more time than anticipated. Another issue is that SecuraSite has been paying fees to have permits and land use expedited and we are reimbursing them.
 - iii. Bjorn shared that additional work was done that wasn't known at the time of the original bid; also some Sites have changed.
 - iv. Discussion about some Sites taking a long time to secure, and how it affects the contract. John shared that he and Ron oversee them during the Site process.

- v. Motion made by Jim Davis to authorize the C800 Board of Directors to issuing a contract amendment in the amount of \$111,300 to SecuraSite for additional site acquisition services. Second by Sue Scobert. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.
- d. *Approval of Site Lease at Hoodland Fire Brightwood Station.
 - i. John shared that as they were finalizing the Microwave design, they found they needed the ability to do a relay of the Microwave from up at the Crutcher Bench Site to get to Brightwood. They will put a Paging Station there, and may put a radio. He noted they met with Joe, Chief John Ingrao and the Board.
 - ii. Motion made by Jim Band to authorize the C800 Board of Directors to enter into a lease of real property for a communications site at the Hoodland Fire Station in Brightwood. Second by Mike Corless. A unanimous vote was case in favor.
- e. *Approval of Purchase of UPS for CCOM Prime Radio Site.
 - i. John apologized for not including this in the packet. He will bring the staff report back to the next meeting. This was tabled until the next meeting.
- f. *Approval of increased monthly stipend for JN Hartsock Project Management.
 - i. Ryan discussed the stipend. He explained this will be an increase for the next 12 months.
 - ii. Motion made by Jim Band to authorize the C800 Board of Directors to approve increasing the monthly stipend for JN Hartsock Project Management to \$4,000 for the calendar year 2019. Second by Vince Stafford. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.

g. Next Board Meeting

i. Next meeting March 20, 2019 at CCOM/EOC at 10:00 AM

10. Open Agenda

- a. John shared that they haven't forgotten about the Aurora/Monitor/Silverton discussion. He has some percentages on how much they are in the county, etc. He shared this will be brought back at a future meeting.
- b. Jim Band had a question on the premium; asking if it was a DAS unit. Ron answered yes. Jim Davis noted this an item on the survey. Discussion followed.
- c. John shared that Motorola has a newer product called personal accountability. John thinks there could be some applicability to Law as well. He will get this information out to the group so the group can see where everyone would want them.
- d. Discussion about bank signatures.
- e. Brett Smith asked who the other law representative was for the committee for the bond funds. Ryan shared that it is Scott Thran from Lake Oswego. Sue shared that he is off for three weeks due to medical leave. Brett shared he will meet with Jim Davis to get the template for the survey.

2019/2020 BUDGET MESSAGE

BACKGROUND

The City of Canby, City of Gladstone, City of Lake Oswego, City of Milwaukie, City of Molalla, City of Oregon City, City of Sandy, City of West Linn, Canby Fire District, Clackamas Fire District Number 1, Colton Fire District, Estacada Fire District, Hoodland Fire District, Molalla Fire District, Sandy Fire District, Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue, Clackamas County Sheriff, Clackamas County Health (herein after "Partners") manage an ORS 190 organization named CLACKAMAS 800 RADIO GROUP (C800). The purpose of the CLACKAMAS 800 RADIO GROUP is to own and operate an effective and cost efficient 800MHz public safety communications system to support public safety to benefit and protect the citizens of Clackamas County.

The organizational and governance format provides an effective approach to public safety communications benefiting law enforcement, fire fighters, emergency medical service providers and the public they serve through a cooperative, partner-managed, information sharing, and communication systems/operations.

This is the eighteenth budget for C800. An initial budget was prepared in FY 2001/2002 but due to the system not being completed there were no operational funds expended. The system became operational in FY 2002/2003 and operational funds were collected and expended.

Clackamas County provided C800 the funding to construct the original 10 site 800MHz radio system. The C800 partners repaid the County through operating funds. In 2016 Clackamas County on behalf of C800 placed a ballot measure on the ballot for the voters of the County to authorize a \$59M general obligation bond to upgrade and expand the system. The measure passed with a 70% margin of approval. The upgrade project to move the system to P25 digital from analog and expand the system by 16 sites is currently underway.

Washington County Consolidated Communications Agency (WCCCA) provides technical management and maintains the radio system under an Intergovernmental Agreement.

GOAL

The goal of C800 is to provide:

"AN EFFECTIVE PUBLIC SAFETY VOICE AND DATA RADIO COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS OPERATING AT MAXIMUM EFFICIENCY -- DELIVERING QUALITY SERVICE -- IN THE MOST COST EFFECTIVE MANNER."

FUNCTION OF THE CLACKAMAS 800 RADIO GROUP

CLACKAMAS 800 RADIO GROUP is performing the following functions:

- A. Implementation of the goals and objectives as established by the C800 Board of Directors including development and implementation of long-range plans to the extent funds are appropriated for that purpose by the Partners.
- B. Adoption of an annual budget and approval of budget modifications as required.
- C. Review and evaluate efforts for effectiveness and conformance with established objectives short and long term.
- D. Approval of new Partners.
- E. Approval of Members who will utilize the radio system and determination of a fee schedule for this use.
- F. Approval of future phases of the Radio System build out including funding strategies for capital and operating costs, recognizing that this power of C800 does not obligate the Partners to participate in the funding or management of future phases assets.
- G. Select and retain personnel as deemed appropriate or required for C800's operations.
- H. Resolve operating problems of the Radio System as brought before the C800 Board.

EXPLANATION OF BUDGET

To enable C800 to perform the above, the Board has directed that a budget be prepared as is allowed under statue for the ORS 190 organization. This is a "Council of Government Budget Process" per ORS 294.900 through ORS 294.930 (as amended 2012). As an ORS 190 organization, CLACKAMAS 800 RADIO GROUP is not permitted to levy taxes.

The revenue for the agency is derived from its Partner contributions, fees and charges instituted for other system users, site use agreements with other entities, grants, and loans.

The Board has adopted a funding formula based upon the number of radios programmed on the system. This formula takes the approved operating cost for C800 and divides it by the number of radios programmed onto the system. This per radio cost is then multiplied against the number of radios programmed by a particular agency on the system thus deriving that agency's cost.

FINANCIAL POLICY

The financial policy of C800 is to run a fiscally sound cost conscience as well as an effective customer service organization. C800 operates on a modified accrual basis for accounting. The Board authorized the retention of the firm Talbot, Korvola, & Warwick, LLP to provide accounting services. Clackamas Fire District provides oversight of payments made on C800's behalf.

C800's budget is being used to operate and maintain the radio system as well as to shape the agency and determine its long-term mission and objectives. Washington County Consolidated Communications Agency (WCCCA) provides technical system management and maintenance of the radio system through an Intergovernmental Agreement with C800.

Personnel loaned by the Partners, consultants, and various vendors perform other duties and services required. Currently there are no personnel retained by the C800 as employees.

FINANCIAL POLICY FEATURES

As outlined above services for the agency will be contracted for or provided by other governmental entities, private sector resources, or Partner agencies by direction of the Board. Likewise, the Board will approve material and service costs as required.

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BUDGET

The following outlines the changes from the approved FY 2018/2019. Materials and Services have increased by 14.9%. Changes include: a) annual increases in radio site property leases in accordance with lease terms and the addition of sites (10.3%); b) Generator fuel due to the site additions and increase fuel storage at the sites (50%) c) HVAC Maintenance due to added sites 57.9% d) Landscape maintenance due to added sites (30.1%) e) Generator Maintenance due to added sites (81.2%) f) Insurance cost (5.7%) g) Utility costs (23.1%); h) WCCCA system fees have increased (13.8%) due to the additional radio counts; i) radio maintenance cost due to aging equipment (5.4%); j). estimated legal fees due to the construction project (37.5%)

C800 and WCCCA are jointly working on the radio replacement project which includes upgrading the current radio system from analog to digital, improving coverage, and enhancing performance. This project was required due to system age, technology advancements, and the inability to support the current system into the future.

The per radio cost has remained the same from the FY 18/19 of \$430 per radio. The cost of \$43.77 per radio for the zone controller upgrade has expired.

CHANGES IN FINANCIAL POLICY

A financial policy has been prepared and approved by Board and there have been no changes.

CONCLUSION

Clackamas 800 Radio Group continues to be an excellent opportunity for the political and public safety jurisdictions; and public safety answering points and dispatch centers; fire and law enforcement and emergency medical service providers; and the citizens of Clackamas County, its cities and districts served by C800. As outlined above C800 is participating with WCCCA to start implement the upgrade to the Public Safety voice and data radio system across Clackamas and Washington County.

REQUEST: It is hereby requested that the C800 Board of Directors authorize C800 to enter into a contract with HPS, Hillsboro, OR in the amount of \$999,103 to construct tower replacements and related work at the Brightwood / Lenhart / Pete's Mtn / Polivka / and Mt Scott sites.

DESCRIPTION: As a part of the communication system upgrade project it was determined that the existing towers at the Brightwood / Lenhart / Pete's Mtn / Polivka / and Mt Scott sites were not adequate to meet our structural resiliency standards and additional antenna loads. We prepared bid documents which were posted on ORPIN on February 22, 2019 for bids. Thirty-two firms downloaded the documents. On March 14, 2019 five firms submitted bid proposals ranging from \$999,103 to \$1,611,660. The project estimate was \$1,075,000. All five firms were qualified and presented the appropriate bids.

HPS was the firm that constructed the Sawtell site and performed to our expectations and we are pleased that they were the successful contractor.

FINANCE: The funds are budgeted in capital outlay as part of the Bond funding.

LEGAL: A C800 construction contract will be utilized as approved by legal counsel.

RECOMMENDATION: It is hereby recommended that the C800 Board of Directors authorize C800 to enter into a contract with HPS, Hillsboro, OR in the amount of \$999,103 to construct tower replacements and related work at the Brightwood / Lenhart / Pete's Mtn / Polivka / and Mt Scott sites.

Re: Approve a Contract for a Fire Station Alerting System for all Clackamas Fire Agencies

REQUEST: It is hereby requested that the C800 Board of Directors approve entering into a contract with US Digital Designs, Tempe, AZ, in the amount of \$1,697,406.94 for the furnishing and installation of a fire station alerting system for all Clackamas Fire Agencies.

DESCRIPTION: Included in the Communications Upgrade Project is the procurement, furnishing, installation (note some agencies will self-install), and commissioning of a comprehensive fire station alerting system. The current fire station alerting solution is antiquated and performs poorly. The utilization of a standard comprehensive system will enhance dispatch and response times all fire agencies.

In accordance with ORS 279A-205 this procurement is being facilitated through a cooperative purchasing agreement. The Public Procurement Authority, Wilsonville, OR, issued a Request for Proposal in October of 2014 for Fire Station Alerting Systems and received 3 proposals on March 17, 2015. The agreement with US Digital is facilitated by National Purchasing Partners of which C800 is a member.

FINANCE: The amount of \$1,435,000 is budgeted in capital outlay as part of the Bond funding. The balance of the cost will be reimbursed by the fire agencies. The bond project will cover \$30,000 of cost per station.

LEGAL: US Digital's cooperative agreement will be utilized as approved by legal counsel.

RECOMMENDATION: It is hereby recommended that the C800 Board of Directors approve entering into a contract with US Digital Designs, Tempe, AZ, in the amount of \$1,697,406.94 for the furnishing and installation of a fire station alerting system for all Clackamas Fire Agencies.
