#### 1. C800 Board Meeting Called to Order at 1030

- 3. Approval of Minutes October 10, 2018 Board Meeting: Steve Bartol made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 10, 2018 board meeting as submitted and the motion was seconded by Jim Davis. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.
- 4. Public Comment: None
- 5. Communications: None
- 6. Financial Report John Hartsock reported that the September report is in the packet and we are tracking on budget with no exceptions to report. John advised that received the October report this morning and will provide it for the next Board meeting.

#### 7. Committee Reports

- a. Executive Committee: Did not meet, nothing to report.
- b. Technical: The next meeting is Nov 28, 2018 9:30a at CCOM.
- c. Citizen Accountability: Next meeting December 18, 2018, CFD Station #17 (19001 S End Road, Oregon City) at 6:30p.

#### 8. Old Business:

- a. System Management: John Hartsock
  - i. Ron had a conflict this morning. As Ron has previously reported we are seeing periodic outages of equipment primarily due to age. We have adequate spares to maintain system operation.
  - ii. The big issue this past month was a tree blew down on Hwy 26 which fell on the PGE transmission lines. The Brightwood site sustained a power outage and the surge protector absorbed the shock. It also tripped the main breaker so when the generator came on, there was no place for the power to go. All was cleaned up and the surge device replaced yesterday and everything working fine.

- b. System Upgrade/Replacement:
  - i. Project Status Bjorn / John -packet handed out.
    - 1. <u>Barton Site:</u> Expected to have land use approval from the county this week; they requested more information which was submitted a couple weeks ago. Preparing building permit applications.
    - 2. <u>Sandy/Damascus/Canby:</u> Still finishing up. Sandy is going through a Microwave design change.
    - 3. <u>Wilsonville</u>: Since we last met, we lost our two interested parties for back up site candidates. John stated we are going to take two approaches: Eileen is attempting to work with Roger's attorney to obtain our required easement and John is looking into eminent domain. We are also looking to see if there are other sites around that ridge.
    - 4. <u>BLM:</u>
    - <u>*Crutcher Bench*</u>-All permits are in hand. Waiting on an approval to do some underground power work. The bridge is nearing completion; hoping by the end of the month. May be able to start some preliminary work before winter hits.
    - <u>*Highland Butte-*</u> Met with BLM and still waiting for their approval of tree removal. Hoping to start soon.
    - 5. <u>4 Forest Service Sites</u>: All still processing with forest service. Expecting to see some approvals by end of year; won't go into construction until late next spring.
    - 6. <u>Lake Oswego:</u> Held a neighborhood meeting regarding the Kerr water tank and people were unhappy. Spoke with the city and decided to pull site off the table for now, and focus on Cook's Butte.
    - 7. <u>Existing Sites</u>: Quality control (QC) Pete's Mountain and Mountain Butte tomorrow; they are virtually done for the ground work. Hoping to QC the remaining four sites within the next couple weeks. Also looking at tower upgrades for all existing sites.
    - 8. <u>Brightwood:</u> Tower replacement. The application is in with BLM.
    - 9. <u>Hoodland:</u> Meeting with Hoodland Board to obtain permission for use. The site will be a microwave hop between Crutcher and Brightwood as well as a paging repeater.
    - 10. Motorola is in the process of installing radio equipment at the sites. They have been at Timberline this week.
    - 11. Chief Hari stated that at the last citizen accountability meeting they talked about letting the public know what is happening. He asked CFD #1 PIO's office to put something together to post on website and social media. John met with the county's PIO's office and they are also going to put something out on their website.
  - ii. Fire Station Alerting/Paging John / (staff report in packet)
    - 1. All the fire agencies in both counties, including Hillsboro, are on board to be a part of the US Digital system.
    - 2. All of Clackamas County agencies have provided their floor plans for engineering, and we are starting to receive final pricing.
    - 3. Working on implementing the software into CAD. Fortunately, both Tritech and US Digital have work together many times. Toni Sexton is coordinating the effort.
    - 4.FSA/Bond Contribution
      - Two options:
        - i. First thought would be to give each agency a certain amount of money per station. This would pay for the controller and some of the installation. A stipend basis, similar to the radios. The challenge with this would be that each agency would enter into a contract with US Digital.

- ii. The other suggestion would be that C800 would enter the contract with US Digital. They would pay for install and controller. Looking at budget if there is any money leftover you can share between agencies.
- Chief Hari stated that he attended a coordination meeting hosted by TVF&R and one of the things that was pointed out was the separate contracting and if you have multiple stations, you may end up rapidly exceeding the purchasing policy and would need board approval, etc. US Digital stated that what they have done in the past is for the radio group to buy the controller and basic equipment, we'd have one contract. If an agency wanted anything else, they can probably find that within their budget without upsetting things.
- Question about transferring the asset. John stated it is no different than the radios. They become assets of the agencies.
- Discussion about what the threshold dollar amount will be so agencies know for budgeting. John will go back through numbers and have ready to address at next meeting.
- John stated that since it will be digital, it will be easier to add display boards, etc. Over time if you want different features, etc. it is easier.
- US Digital has done 4,000 some stations and stated it is increasing turnout time by 30 seconds.
- Chief Hari stated that in theory, everything the agencies have now should work with the new controller. You should be able to use everything that C800 provides and use in your station unless you want to upgrade things.
- iii. Portable/Mobile Radio Deployment John
  - 1. Deployment is moving along, but not quite as quickly or seamlessly as we or Motorola would like. We are still waiting on the dates for upgrades to existing radios. John advised to let him know if you have any problems with new radios. Motorola will be paying more attention when they deliver radios to make sure you have the accessories you want and understand radio operation.
  - 2. Received a note from Chief Josh Williams at Aurora Fire about radio upgrades. We have money in the budget (stipend \$) for upgrade of their radios. They asked if we could provide them with 10 radios out of the project; but they are willing to join/pay the annual cost to have a radio on the system. There is discussion of them wanting to come to CCOM for dispatch.
    - a. Chief Davis stated that they brought in all their radios, they were all analog. He stated that Aurora does a lot with Canby and TVF&R, so it is critical that they are able to talk with us. He also stated that having the dual ban is critical and then if they did come into CCOM, they would already have the correct radios.
    - b. Question if Aurora is in Clackamas Co. due to the question about which tax payers are paying for the project.
    - c. Aurora is currently dispatched with MetComm. John stated that their concern is that they come as a mutual aid and are primarily volunteer. Question about bringing them to CCOM. Cheryl stated they had reached out to inquire about switching, and that she needs three years of call volume from them to look into switching and she hasn't been given that information yet.
    - d. John will do more research and bring back to the group to look at for Aurora and Monitor.

- iv. Use of Bond Premium Funds-John (staff report in packet)
  - 1. John noted that as shown on the project budget report that there are \$7.1 million dollars.in premium dollars. It is ultimately the Clackamas Board of Commissioners' decision. They will take input from the citizen's accountability committee and C800. A copy of the bond title and the explanatory statement are included in the staff report.
  - 2. The project has expended about 50% of the bond funds. John projects that it will probably be June of next year before we can sit down and know what is left. John advised that nothing stops us from starting to make a list of uses for the premium dollars.
  - 3. Question about if the money needs to be spent? John stated that it can be refunded to the voters. He stated that in his experience that most entities don't do this because it is such a minimal amount. Discussion that at the citizen accountability meeting, was that they were in favor of spending it on something we need to further their safety.

#### 9. New Business: (\*Action Item)

- a. \* Revised approval to award a contract for upgrades and expansion of the microwave system to Microwave Networks Inc. This was already approved last meeting but there was an error in the dollar amount; still under what we budgeted.
  - i. Motion made by Mike Corless to authorize C800 board of directors to approve awarding a revised contract in the amount of \$2,671,467 to Microwave Networks Inc. for the design, furnishing, and installation of upgrades and expansion of the microwave communications network. Motion seconded by Sue Scobert. A unanimous vote was cast in favor.
- b. Retirements/Board Elections
  - i. Chief Morrisey has retired. The board is comprised of Chief Bartol and Chief Hari. Chief Bartol will be retiring early next year; June at the latest. Elections will be in January. It could be a whole new E-Board if this group chooses. Chief Hari stated he would be willing to extend his term if this group so chooses.
- c. 2019 Board Meeting Dates
  - i. Cheryl is recommending a move of the meeting to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of every month to coincide with the CCOM Member Board meetings and moving the start time to 10 AM for C800 and 11AM for CCOM.
- d. Next Board Meeting
  - i. Next meeting December 12, 2018 at CCOM/EOC / Subsequently canceled moved to Jan 23, 2019 at CCOM/EOC 10A.

It is always our mission to keep insurance costs low so our members can make the most out of budgeted funds. However, a combination of national, state, and SDIS pool factors have resulted in a higher increase in rates than normal.

- Liability rates will be increasing by an average of 4%, per the Rate Lock Agreement.
- For the first time in four years, we are increasing our property rates due to our property reinsurance costs rising about 13%.

Please be sure to review the Comparison Report in the back of the renewal packet. This will show the change in rates as well as how your district's individual contribution is affected by any changes in exposures that you may have experienced in the last year.

#### **New Liability Coverage Documents**

ADMINISTERED BY

The new liability coverage documents are set to be issued January 1, 2019. The purposes of these new documents are to enhance or broaden coverage, follow industry standards, provide more flexibility, clarify coverage intentions, remove inconsistencies and maintain our fiduciary responsibility to the SDIS Trust. The current SDIS Liability Coverage Document is being replaced by four (4) new documents.

- 1. Liability Coverage Document
- 2. Auto Liability Coverage Document
- 3. Auto Liability Excess Coverage Document
- 4. Auto Supplemental Coverage Document

#### New Liability Coverage Changes Effective January 1, 2019

In the previous document we tied coverage specifically to the Oregon Tort Claims Act, Federal Acts and claims outside of Oregon. Coverage A now states if our negligence causes bodily injury, personal injury or property damage, we will provide coverage unless specifically excluded. Coverage B now provides coverage for Wrongful Acts, unless specifically excluded. Coverage will apply to Oregon, Federal and out of state claims.

In an effort to improve consistency, we also revised the Additional Coverages Section of the document. For those additional coverages that provide for defense costs only, members will be able to name their own counsel. For additional coverages that include more than just defense costs, the Trust will select counsel to account for the possibility of a claim becoming a true liability claim, such as the BOLI Defense Coverage.

OSHA Defense Coverage is being removed as an Additional Coverage. We believe this coverage should be provided as a workers' compensation benefit and we have written the coverage into the Safety Net Coverages in the SDIS Workers' Compensation Coverage Document.

We excluded Auto Liability from the Liability Coverage Document and created three separate documents to better provide auto liability coverage. This will give us more flexibility and better control over auto liability claims.

The Underlying Auto Liability Limit will be \$500,000 and the Auto Excess Limit will be either \$4,500,000 or \$9,500,000 to be consistent with the total liability limit of the member.

One benefit of separating the Auto Liability from the Liability Coverage Document is to separate auto terms and conditions from liability coverage. This will more accurately reflect the exposure in our pricing. Additionally, Oregon Law requires that the Uninsured Motorist/Underinsured Motorist limit be the same as the Auto Liability limit, so this will allow us to limit our uninsured/underinsured motorist exposure to \$500,000 for no fault coverage. Previously, we could have had up to \$10,000,000 limit of exposure.

We will mail a copy of the new coverage documents to each member as well as post them on the Insurance Site after the January 1, 2019 renewal date.

As consideration for an additional contribution paid by the **Named Participant**, in the amount of **\$2,563.00**, the **Property Coverage Document** is amended as follows:

Section XII. Coverage Extensions, is amended to add the following Coverage Extension:

#### L. Extension of Coverage for Property Damaged by Earth Movement

Subject to the additional conditions and limitations set forth below, we will indemnify you for direct physical loss or damage to **Covered Property** caused by or resulting from **earth movement** that occurs on premises listed on the Schedule of Property Values on file with the Trust.

- 1. This **Coverage Extension** is subject to per-occurrence deductibles as follows:
  - **a.** The deductible shall be no less than the greater of:
    - (1) \$5,000;

    - (3) the Deductible stated in the Declarations.
  - **b.** The deductible shall be no more than the greater of:
    - (1) \$50,000; or
    - (2) the Deductible stated in the Declarations.
- 2. For the purposes of this **Coverage Extension** only, **earth movement** means:
  - a. sudden and accidental earthquake, seaquake, shock, tremor, landslide, submarine landslide, avalanche, subsidence, sinkhole collapse, mud flow, rock fall, volcanic activity, or any similar seismic activity, resulting in cracking, crumbling, lateral movement, rising, shifting, settling, sinking, or upheaval of land;
  - b. flood that would not have occurred but for tsunami caused by, resulting from, or arising out of earth movement, regardless of any other cause or event that contributes concurrently or in any sequence to such flood; and
  - c. collapse directly caused by earth movement.



- **3. Earth movement** does not mean, and we will not indemnify you or anyone else for, damage caused by, resulting from, or consisting of:
  - **a.** Gradual cracking, crumbling, horizontal, lateral or vertical movement, rising, shifting, settling, sinking, or upheaval of **land**, occurring over a period of fourteen or more days, caused by, or arising out of artificial means or artificially created soil conditions, including contraction, corrosion, erosion, excessive or insufficient moisture, expansion, freezing, improperly compacted soil, insufficient fill, liquefaction, slope instability, slumping, subsidence, or thawing;
  - **b.** Gradual cracking, crumbling, horizontal, lateral or vertical movement, rising, shifting, settling, sinking, or upheaval of **land**, occurring over a period of fourteen or more days, caused by, or arising out of underground activity of animals, vegetation, or **water**; or
  - c. any water movement or flood, except for flood that would not have occurred but for tsunami caused by, resulting from, or arising out of earth movement as described in section XII.L.2. above.
- 4. All earth movement that occurs within a 72-hour period will constitute a single occurrence.
- 5. This **Coverage Extension** does not apply, and we will not indemnify you for any damage or loss caused by or resulting from **earth movement**, unless the damaged **Covered Property** is expressly identified on the Schedule of Property Values on file with the Trust as having coverage for **earth movement**.
- 6. This **Coverage Extension** does not apply, and we will not indemnify you for any damage or loss caused by or resulting from **earth movement**, unless the damage or loss occurs during the **Property Coverage Period**, and is discovered and reported to the Trust by you within one year of the ending date of the **Property Coverage Period**.
- 7. This **Coverage Extension** does not apply, and we will not indemnify you for any damage or loss caused by or resulting from **earth movement**, unless you notify us as soon as reasonably possible after the **earth movement** occurs and allow us to inspect the damaged **Covered Property** prior to making any repairs or replacing the damaged or destroyed **Covered Property**.
- 8. Indemnification under this **Coverage Extension** is subject to the following limits:
  - a. The most we will pay under this Coverage Extension for all damage or loss sustained by the Named Participant in any single occurrence is \$10,000,00 ;
  - b. The most we will pay under this Coverage Extension for all damage or loss sustained by the Named Participant during the Coverage Period, is an Annual Aggregate Loss Limit of \$10,000,000 ;
  - c. The SDIS Per-Occurrence Aggregate Loss Limit;
  - d. an SDIS Annual Aggregate Loss Limit of \$300,000,000 for all damage or loss caused by, resulting from, or arising out of either earth movement, flood, or both.
